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Local nonprofit seeks to double the amount of first-generation college graduates across Central Texas

You may be surprised to learn that Austin, Texas, one of the most vibrant cities in the world, has the lowest college graduation rate in the state for children from under-resourced communities – only 8% go on to earn a college degree.

This is a tremendous loss of opportunity and talent for a region where 9 out of 10 new jobs require a college education. The good news is there is a solution to this problem. For 18 years, Breakthrough Central Texas has been guided by the belief that a child's outcomes should not be determined by his or her zip code.

Starting in middle school, Breakthrough makes a radical 12-year commitment, providing the right intervention at the right time, to help children become the first in their family to earn a college degree. From sixth grade through college graduation, Breakthrough offers out-of-school learning experiences, leadership skills, and comprehensive advising to each of our students. Our commitment ensures long-term success, and our model is proven.

The life-changing power of a college degree is undeniable. Still the most proven path out of poverty, college graduates tend to be healthier, less reliant on public assistance, more civically engaged and, as parents, actively involved in their own children's education.

Every parent wants the best for their children, and so do we. We believe in our families and their potential. We offer an extra helping hand that is always there when you need us. We believe in the Breakthrough model because it works.

That is why we feel called to challenge ourselves and our community to do more. We have set a North Star goal to double the number of students from Central Texas' under-resourced communities who become the first in their family to graduate from college. Earlier this month, we publicly announced the Breakthrough Challenge, a \$10 million campaign to do just that. Over the next 5 years, Breakthrough

- Launch an endowment, The Promise Fund, to ensure that Breakthrough can always fulfill the 12 year promise it make to each of its students.
- Pilot a new whole-school model, investing in the capacity of schools serving our most vulnerable students, so that thousands more can benefit from the life-changing power of a college degree.


